

Glittery, Glitzy a Splendid Embellishment

The beaded book, a Miniature Work of Art, showcases a multitude of beading techniques and powerful ways in which color, texture and sheen can be used.

Learn how to make beaded fabric pages to create a custom made book of extravagant embellishments. Hand painted felt and organza will be used to create the fabric pages.

Beading will begin in class. Pages will be beaded using different techniques including surface bead work, embroidery stitches with beads and bead edgings. Gail's special stitched book binding will be worked by students on a mock up book in class. They will then be able to bind and complete the beaded pages comfortably at home having the confidence, examples, notes and videos for this and other methods of working.

This course is for anyone who has the patience to work with small items, no matter your skill level. If you have handled a needle in the past or present or are an avid stitcher, this course may be for you.

Materials provided by Students: Felt, organza fusible webbing, beads, needles and threads. A very specific supply list will be sent to you upon registration.

Gail will supply, dyes, fixatives, student notes and videos approximately \$50.00 and payable in class





Glittery, Glitzy and Splendid Embellishment

The beaded book, a Miniature Work of Art, showcases a multitude of beading techniques and powerful ways in which color, texture and sheen can be used. You will be learning to work in the time honored artisanal style. The functionality of this book is in its beauty.

Our Time Together - Spending time together in the classroom allows students the ability to strengthen learning possibilities. You will dye your own fabrics, and begin to create pages for your book but also see how others make their decisions. Ideally this class suits a 5 day schedule. I am finding that students typically have a difficult time getting away from home for longer than 3 days. So I have organized the class time into one powerful 3 day working session together with 2 online sessions to follow the class. New learning material in the form of videos and power point presentations will be given at the sessions. Online sessions become more robust and interactive when we have met as a group in the classroom first. The online sessions will be recorded for those who miss a session or who would like to have the recordings.

Select a color scheme for your book choosing from sumptuous colors before your class even begins. Gail will present you with an assortment of dye colorways that can be used. Once you have chosen the color scheme you will be able to make bead choices based on your chosen color scheme. Each fabric page will be hand painted in the classroom. Students will have assistance and advice about color mixing and techniques.

Each step of the journey involves a layer of structure and planning to make your own individual creation. The focus of beading is on the fabric page and also on fabric edges - learning to make simple patterned effects using different bead types and sizes. Learn how to create an original stitched spine for the book using hand dyed threads for the purpose. Create a colorful sketchbook for documentation and display-using your sketchbook as a journal, working in it as you progress throughout the course.



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Learn to Dye like a Professional

You don't have to be a professional in order to dye like one. We will dye a couple of threads in multicolors for the spine of the book also dye fabric pages. Our students have been learning this process for 30 years at our studio.







Gail Harker, LCGI,

Gail is a Canadian who resided for nearly 20 years in Britain, until returning to the US in 1995. She moved to Britain in 1976 with her American husband and family. She studied art in Canada, England and Scotland. She completed both Parts 1 and 2 (Diploma) of the City & Guilds Design and Embroidery course with *Distinction* in both parts. She was awarded the Senior Award of Licentiateship (LCGI) by the City & Guilds Institute. Gail has previously taught City & Guilds Embroidery courses, and was, for many years, a City & Guilds External Verifier for various colleges in Great Britain. She has authored five books: *Embroidery Skills: Machine Embroidery* (published internationally in five languages), *Fairy Tale Quilts and Embroidery, Christmas Stitches, Creative Machine Embroidery* and *Tassel Making.* She is a contributing author to: *Starting to Stitch Creatively* (Batsford and the *Merehurst Book of Needlework.* Since moving to the United States she has directed and taught at the Arts Center she founded in Washington State - Gail Harker Center for Creative Arts. She has taught Certificate and Diploma Courses in Design and Embroidery to hundreds of students from all parts of North America.

My Approach to Beads

My approach to working with all things related to embroidery and beading developed through my own experience teaching design, textile and extended certificate courses to a variety of people over 30 years in the U.K., U.S. and Canada. Beadwork has a long and varied rich international historic background. Contemporary experimentation with patterns and colors makes for exciting effects..
