Take a day away from this busy season to begin a very special little Sketchbook with stitches. We will begin by painting some sketchbook pages and then prepare the pages for the stitches.



Gail has previously been a teacher of several City and Guilds Embroidery courses, and was, for several years, a City and Guilds External Verifier for various colleges in Great Britain. Since moving to the United States and for the last 26 years, she has taught Certificate and Diploma Classes in Design and Embroidery to students from all parts of North America.
