Fabric Collage is an exciting technique. The class is suitable for the beginner, for anyone who would like to try playing with collage and those who would like to increase their stitch vocabulary. The emphasis is on stitching and fabric manipulation. We'll start with focusing on working with a few specific white fabrics. We use their different qualities to manipulate and then arrange small compositions into an artful collage. I'm using the word collage in a broad sense but feel that these small fabric compositions fit into a loose painterly style of working after they are dyed. You can choose from a wide range of hand stitches to apply to the collage. Each will be demonstrated in class.

The next part of the workshop focuses on dyeing the fabric collages. This is a straightforward method that uses small amounts of dye and very little time. The dyeing method, using Procion MX creates beautiful effects.



We'll finish up with another collage, this time beginning with

colorful fabrics and stitches to create a collage with fabric and more hand stitch. Design is incorporated into all the processes, techniques and use of stitches.

In this course, you will learn how to:

- collage unique fabrics together
- use a variety of stitches and edgings
- dyeing using Procion MX for fantastic colors work with this simple but effective method
- add colorful threads to emphasize areas of your composition.



This class is open to all experience levels.

You will receive a supply list of

materials that you will need for the course. Please note: There will be a lab fee of \$25.00 for various - items including fabrics and dyes used during the course. The

lab fee is payable at the class. You will also receive a short list of other materials you will need for the course.
