Course Aims

- * The course is aimed at taking students beyond level 1 Machine Embroidery technique, to do free machining with and without the use of a hoop.
- * Learn how to create simplified designs and to work with a variety of substrates. Either place embroideries into a sketchbook or choose to keep them as individual samples.
- * Learn how to draw with the needle even if you think you can't draw.
- Derive inspiration and design ideas from photos and imagination
- Trace and draw freestyle with the needle
- Explore and experiment with free machine stitch using running stitch and others for a textural quality.
- Learn how to integrate design, color and stitch, for innovative effects
- Understand stitch construction and execution
- Gain a working knowledge of a range of fabrics, threads and papers suitable for stitchery and for working without a hoop
- Develop knowledge of the tools, materials and equipment used.
- Create a customized *Library of Small Stitched Samples* using a variety of media in your individual style
- Learn to document and evaluate your work

Machine Stitch Series Session #2

Drawing with a Needle





This is a great class for those who are trying out free machine techniques for the first time. It is also serves for those who would like to brush up their skills and increase their confidence level.

The focus of this free machine embroidery session is to learn how to use your machine needle like a pencil

- * to draw simple images on unique substrates.
- * You will learn how to doodle, draw from memory and from tracings.
- * Develop a new vocabulary of patterns and images
- * learn how to slow down and relax while using your sewing machine.
- * Challenge yourself with new needle and thread possibilities.
- * You can bring your own inspirational photos or pictures or use ones that Gail provides.
- * Choose any type of plant or animal form flowers, weeds, foliage, potted plants or another choice of inspiration. Paints, colored pencils and felt pens will be used to color the fabrics in the online session following the studio session
- * Finish the class with a Sketchbook of interesting embroidered images.

- Machine Embroidery techniques have a unique appearance all to themselves..
- * Create free machine embroidery stitches such as long and short filling, granite, vermicelli and others to produce images from nature and lush landscapes effects.
- * Make freeform dimensional leaves or flowers.
- * Learn to stitch with fabric in a hoop.
- * Each of these techniques use different methods of working. You can try all of these effects or choose to spend more time developing one method.


Lace, Collage and Open Work Session #4

We will be exploring soluble fabrics, tulle, machine threads and other open weave fabrics to create lace like surfaces with distinctive patterned holes. Students will be able to sample a variety of techniques and choose an image to work with. Burning holes with a burning tool will be demonstrated as an exciting way to work with the material.



A number of patterns can be created to make the effects unique. Add richness and complexity to your artwork by building layers of different types and shapes of holes. Other fabric or images under the lace can create dimensionality to the effect .Contrasting or subtle color and tonal effects dramatize the entire piece.







Gail Harker, LCGI,

Gail is a Canadian who resided for nearly 20 years in Britain, until returning to the US in 1995. She moved to Britain in 1976 with her American husband and family. She studied art in Canada, England and Scotland. She completed both Parts 1 and 2 (Diploma) of the City & Guilds Design and Embroidery course with *Distinction* in both parts. She was awarded the Senior Award of Licentiateship (LCGI) by the City & Guilds Institute. Gail has previously taught City & Guilds Embroidery courses, and was, for many years, a City & Guilds External Verifier for various colleges in Great Britain. She has authored five books: *Embroidery Skills: Machine Embroidery* (published internationally in five languages), *Fairy Tale Quilts and Embroidery, Christmas Stitches, Creative Machine Embroidery* and *Tassel Making*. She is a contributing author to: *Starting to Stitch Creatively* (Batsford and the *Merehurst Book of Needlework*. Since moving to the United States she has directed and taught at the Arts Center she founded in Washington State - Gail Harker Center for Creative Arts. She has taught Certificate and Diploma Courses in Design and Embroidery to hundreds of students from all parts of North America.

My Approach to Machine Embroidery

My approach to machine embroidery developed through my own experience teaching design, textile and extended certificate courses to a variety of people over 30 years in the U.K., U.S. and Canada. The needle is similar to a fine pen or pencil - in other words, an art tool. It is possible to create designs on all types of fabrics and papers. The visual effects are exciting and limitless.
