- Learn about the impressionists and some history behind the use of pointillistic techniques.
- Learn to choose the major design lines and create your pattern.
- Develop your composition with pieces of fabric.
- Get tricks and techniques to secure fabric pieces.
- Stitch your collage with a variety of hand and machine stitches.



This Course blends collage with hand and machine stitch to interpret a landscape in an impressionistic style. Guided by the elements of art and principles of design,

we'll be looking at color, values, shapes, balance, and harmony to create your oneof-a-kind textile art piece.

This class is for beginners to advanced experience levels. Stitch artists, quilters, or anyone interested in trying textiles as an art form are welcome!

The collage can be made with just hand or just machine stitching, if you prefer one over the other.

You will receive a supply list of materials that you will need for the course.

Her hands-on individual mentoring style helps students develop their pieces to reflect themselves and their experiences.
