

This course is the foundation of all fabric and stitch courses at our center. Make time for the journey!

- Learn more about color than you ever thought possible and work confidently with it
- Learn about Color Theory using brights, tints and shades to develop a sensitive palette of values.
 Document your findings.
- Use earth's gentle color (neutralized) schemes or the more vibrant brighter schemes. Find out how to create colors from the world around you or those that you just like.
- Begin a Sketchbook to document all of the wonderful things that happen with color.





- Create a prismatic (bright) and a neutralized (paler, darker or duller) color wheel from dyed fabric and create small fabric pieces in the same colors.
- Learn to prepare and dye **specialized fab- rics** that can be used afterwards for quilters and stitchers (embroiderers). We will be dyeing small pieces of fabric particularly for samples the class will be working on after Session 1.
- Learn the stages of thread preparation and dyeing methods we have used so successfully at our studios.
- Learn about the Systematic Color Schemes and why they create so many unique sets of colors that you wouldn't have previously known or considered.
- Create many of the Systematic Color Schemes using dyed fabrics, overlays of sheers and applique
- Learn to create colors by layering fabrics and placing the right colors in best proportions next to each other.

Make Organic Art from Color, Line, and Texture

- Learn about Systematic Color Schemes in a Color sketchbook
- Learn to trust your own reactions to the way color is applied.
- Develop a number of different types of color schemes through use of the color wheel, values, saturation and contrast.
- Apply color skills to collage, applique and stitch
- Your sketchbook and dyed fabrics will be a source of knowledge and inspiration for years to come!








Student Sketchbook—Systematic Color Scheme

Gail Harker, LCGI,

Gail is a Canadian who resided for nearly 20 years in Britain, until returning to the US in 1995. She moved to Britain in 1976 with her American husband and family. She studied art in Canada, England and Scotland. She completed both Parts 1 and 2 (Diploma) of the City & Guilds Design and Embroidery course with *Distinction* in both parts. She was awarded the Senior Award of Licentiateship (LCGI) by the City & Guilds Institute. Gail has previously taught City & Guilds Embroidery courses, and was, for many years, a City & Guilds External Verifier for various colleges in Great Britain. She has authored five books: *Embroidery Skills: Machine Embroidery* (published internationally in five languages), *Fairy Tale Quilts and Embroidery, Christmas Stitches, Creative Machine Embroidery* and *Tassel Making*. She is a contributing author to: *Starting to Stitch Creatively* (Batsford and the *Merehurst Book of Needlework*. Since moving to the United States she has directed and taught at the Arts Center she founded in Washington State - Gail Harker Center for Creative Arts. She has taught Certificate and Diploma Courses in Design and Embroidery to hundreds of students from all parts of North America.

My Approach to Color

My approach to dyeing fabric and threads developed through my own experience teaching design, textile and extended certificate courses to a variety of people over 30 years in the U.K., U.S. and Canada. There are so many different ways to approach color. I consider Color to be one of the most important elements of art and design and have developed an extensive color course for our students.
