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In this class we will be creating many samples of plant life to try out different stitches, styles and techniques.

Explore Looking like an artist to see how you can exploit the best qualities of plant life. Use your imagination to reinvent Nature with your needle.

Become inspired to look at your garden in an entirely unique way. Long past the time that flowers fade you will be able to enjoy the aspects of plant forms, their colors and forms. Its fun to interpret the stitches, techniques and other ways that plants can be as exuberant in machine stitch as they are in reality.

Course Aims


This course is aimed at taking students beyond level 1 Machine Embroidery technique. Students will be learning how to create simplified individual designs and to work with a variety of substrates. Students will learn how to place embroideries into a sketchbook or can choose to keep them as individual samples. Other things you will be doing:

- Learning how to draw with the needle even if you think you can't draw.
- Deriving inspiration and design ideas from photos and imagination
- Tracing and drawing freestyle with the needle
- Explore and experiment with free machine stitch using running stitch and others for a textural quality.
- Learn how to integrate design, color and stitch, for innovative effects
- Understand stitch construction and execution
- Gain a working knowledge of a range of fabrics, threads and papers suitable for stitchery and for working without a hoop
- Develop knowledge of the tools, materials and equipment used.
- Learn how to develop a stitch sketchbook and notebook to explore and display ideas
- Create a customized *Library of Small Stitched Samples* using a variety of media in your individual style
- Learn to document and evaluate your work

Those who have studied level 1 Machine are qualified to apply.







Paints, colored pencils and felt pens will be used to color the fabrics. Dimensional and flat shapes can be created. You can bring your own inspirational photos or pictures or use mine. I have a large library of photos.. You can choose any type of plant form flowers, weeds, foliage, potted plants or another choice of inspiration. Bring a few different types so you can try out lots of ideas. Gail

Gail Harker, LCGI,

Gail is a Canadian who resided for nearly 20 years in Britain, until returning to the US in 1995. She moved to Britain in 1976 with her American husband and family. She studied art in Canada, England and Scotland. She completed both Parts 1 and 2 (Diploma) of the City & Guilds Design and Embroidery course with *Distinction* in both parts. She was awarded the Senior Award of Licentiateship (LCGI) by the City & Guilds Institute. Gail has previously taught City & Guilds Embroidery courses, and was, for many years, a City & Guilds External Verifier for various colleges in Great Britain. She has authored five books: *Embroidery Skills: Machine Embroidery* (published internationally in five languages), *Fairy Tale Quilts and Embroidery, Christmas Stitches, Creative Machine Embroidery* and *Tassel Making*. She is a contributing author to: *Starting to Stitch Creatively* (Batsford and the *Merehurst Book of Needlework*. Since moving to the United States she has directed and taught at the Arts Center she founded in Washington State - Gail Harker Center for Creative Arts. She has taught Certificate and Diploma Courses in Design and Embroidery to hundreds of students from all parts of North America.

My Approach to Machine Embroidery

My approach to machine embroidery developed through my own experience teaching design, textile and extended certificate courses to a variety of people over 30 years in the U.K., U.S. and Canada. The needle is similar to a fine pen or pencil - in other words, an art tool. It is possible to create designs on all types of fabrics and papers. The visual effects are exciting and limitless.
