

Who is this Course for?

Anyone who would like to learn more about Color and creating custom art fabric. The colored fabric can either stand on its own as an art item or used as a background for other artwork such as appliques collages, embroidery, or quilting. You will be able to record your work by simultaneously keeping a Sketchbook (Journal)

Create in Your Own Environment

The course focuses on creating 25+ small art fabrics using (mostly) fabric paints. Rich color renderings produce enlivened color and textural qualities that can be used for symbolism and storytelling. For some of you this may be the first time you have worked with these methods in a more complex way. You do not need special equipment to work as I will provide full instructions on how to set up a controlled workspace within your home.

Layers of Color, Resist Images and Other Effects

Students will be designing and painting in the following areas: Layers of Color, Resist Images and Other Effects. Other Effects include overprinting and use of other media such as colored pencils, fabric pencils, crayons, and pens.


Fabrics Make the Difference

Fabric type and quality play a large part in the varied visual effects that can be accomplished. Each fabric has a characteristic feature of its own. Four unique fabrics will be recommended but you can add more and play with others if you like. I will be demonstrating and talking about several fabric types. I will focus on the painted fabric from the method of paint application to the *feel* (hand) of the fabric after it is painted to how fabric is dried and color fixed. There is a wealth of material in the form of Power Point Presentations and videos that will be processed in each online class session and then sent to students after each session.

Layers of Color and Other Effects

Learn about Systematic Color Schemes and how to use them.

Use color proportion in Systematic Color Schemes

Use light to dark and bright to neutralized values!

Use texture to show movement and directionality.

Use styles such as radiational, horizontal, vertical, and organic.

Use subtlety to blur and bleed line edges.

Use crisp sharp lines and soft diffused ones.

Use complex colors by premixing colors.

Use complex colors by mixing colors on the fabric

Resist Images

Use fabric manipulation to create different resists.

Gather a collection of resist materials.

Make your own resist materials.

Learn to create mini designs using some of the elements of art and design.

Draw and cut out plastics, papers, and foam.

Make stencils and templates.

Create abstract patterns using the elements of art and design.

Draw on painted fabric with colored pencils, crayons.

Combine images to create interesting and imaginative positive and negative spaces.

Gail is a Canadian who resided for nearly 20 years in Britain, until returning to the US in 1995. She moved to Britain in 1976 with her American husband and family. She studied art in Canada, England and Scotland. She completed both Parts 1 and 2 (Diploma) of the City & Guilds Design and Embroidery course with *Distinction* in both parts. She was awarded the Senior Award of Licentiateship (LCGI) by the City & Guilds Institute. Gail has previously taught City & Guilds Embroidery courses, and was, for many years, a City & Guilds External Verifier for various colleges in Great Britain. She has authored five books: *Embroidery Skills: Machine Embroidery* (published internationally in five languages), *Fairy Tale Quilts and Embroidery*, *Christmas Stitches, Creative Machine Embroidery* and *Tassel Making*. She is a contributing author to: *Starting to Stitch Creatively* (Batsford and the *Merehurst Book of Needlework*. Since moving to the United States she has directed and taught at the Arts Center she founded in Washington State - Gail Harker Center for Creative Arts. She has taught Certificate and Diploma Courses in Design and Embroidery to hundreds of students from all parts of North America.
